

How to Choose the Right Mini Digger for Your Dublin Job

1. Find out what kind of project you have and how big it is.

- For small jobs around the house, like redesigning a garden, putting up fence posts, or making driveways, micro or 1-ton diggers are best.
- For medium-sized jobs like building patios, septic tanks, or retaining walls, you usually need a mini digger that weighs between 1.5 and 2.5 tons.
- A 3-ton digger may be needed for commercial or utility work that involves heavier loads or deeper trenches to give you more stability and reach.

2 Look at the site's access and space limits.

When picking a digger, one of the most important things to think about is how easy it is to get to. In Dublin's older neighborhoods, there are narrow driveways, side entrances, and small gardens. It's a big mistake to buy or rent a machine that can't even get to the job site.

These problems can be best solved with micro diggers, which are also known as 0.8-ton compact excavators. They can get through normal doors and garden gates that are only 70 to 80 centimeters wide. Their

small size means they don't hurt the ground too much, but they still have enough hydraulic power to dig, lift, and swing quickly.

It is strong and easy to move, so a 1.5-ton machine is a good choice for sites with a little more space or an open front. Before they drop off the equipment, the DCM Hire delivery team checks the access dimensions to make sure it fits perfectly where you need it.

3 Find out about the ground and the land

The kind of soil and how the land is shaped are very important to your choice. Some places in Dublin need more traction or digging strength because the ground is made of clay, gravel, and soft garden soil.

- Clay or hard ground: needs more power and a deeper bucket penetration. Models that weigh 2 to 3 tons are best for this.
- Soft garden soil or grass: A light micro digger is good for not digging too deep or hurting the grass.
- Diggers with wide tracks are better for sites that aren't level or are sloped because they are more stable.
